March 28, 2024 | Charlotte, NC – The Charlotte Symphony Orchestra (CSO) is thrilled to announce the first in a series of experimental immersive events, MERGE: Symphonic x Electronic, a multisensory experience at the nexus of symphonic and electronic music at Blackbox Theater on Friday, May 10 and Saturday, May 11, 2024, at 9:00 p.m. Producer and DJ Liam Collins, known by his stage name Push/Pull, visual artist Tenorless, and the Charlotte Symphony — led by Resident Conductor Christopher James Lees — will take audiences on an exploration at the edges of musical possibility alongside live visual artistry.

This groundbreaking program will include works by composers on the cutting edge, like Philip Glass, Steve Reich, and John Luther Adams, merged with ambient downtempo soundscapes crafted by Push/Pull. Throughout the performance, the space will come alive with stunning projected visuals curated by visual artist Tenorless, enhancing the multisensory experience. The evening will also feature original compositions by Push/Pull, as well as arrangements by Benjamin Hjertmann crafted specifically for the Charlotte Symphony to merge with the electronic music, transcending conventional musical boundaries.

"It's been incredibly exhilarating to collaborate with Push/Pull Sound and fuse our distinct musical styles into this thrilling program," said Resident Conductor Christopher James Lees. "In today's multimedia-driven society, we hear as much with our eyes as we do with our ears, and we listen with our entire body at any performance. At MERGE, we'll put the audience at the center of this visceral experience, fully immersing the room in sound and light."

"When these two worlds — classical and electronic — come together, they remind us that at their heart, both are simply tools in the hands of artists. Instruments and computers alike sit silently until brought to life by human creativity and passion," said Push/Pull. "This event

celebrates the merging of classical music's tradition, virtuosity, and composition with the expansive new sound design possibilities that electronic music provides. As we look forward to this unique blend of past and future, tradition and innovation, we're reminded of the limitless potential of music to evolve and inspire."

"I am excited to introduce audiences to our inaugural immersive event, marking the beginning of an experimental series of innovative initiatives aimed at redefining the orchestral experience and engaging new audiences," said Charlotte Symphony President and CEO David Fisk. "We are deeply grateful for the Knight Foundation's invaluable support and shared vision as we continue to push the boundaries of traditional concert experiences."

MERGE: Symphonic x Electronic is presented in partnership with Blumenthal Arts and is part of the Charlotte Symphony's experimentation of the possibilities of immersive experiences, funded by a generous grant from the Knight Art + Tech Expansion Fund of the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation.
