CHORAL STUDENTS TO DEBUT WITH CHARLOTTE SYMPHONY

November 5, 2015 | CHARLOTTE, NC – Seven local high school choral students will experience the thrill of performing live with the Charlotte Symphony November 19-21 at Belk Theater at Blumenthal Performing Arts Center.

The concerts, which will feature the Fauré *Requiem*, will mark the debut of the 2015-2016 Young Artists in Residence program, a new immersive choral initiative of the Charlotte Symphony Chorus.

Students who won auditions come from Charlotte-Mecklenburg and Gaston County schools and have spent the last two months rehearsing the *Requiem* weekly with the Charlotte Symphony Chorus.

“It has been a pleasure to work with these fine young musicians,” says Kenney Potter, director of choruses for the Charlotte Symphony. “This is a great opportunity for them to perform Fauré’s choral masterwork in a professional-caliber setting with the Charlotte Symphony and Charlotte Symphony Chorus.”
