Watch as the Martha Connerton/Kinetic Works company dances, and wait for goosebumps as you listen to the Charlotte Symphony Chorus perform Morten Lauridsen's moving "O Magnum Mysterium," plus songs from *It's a Wonderful Life* and *Frozen*.
