August 2, 2023 | **Charlotte, NC** – Internationally acclaimed soprano and 2023 Kennedy Center honoree Renée Fleming returns to Charlotte to join Conductor Laureate Christopher Warren-Green and the Charlotte Symphony for the Annual Gala Concert on <u>Wednesday, September 20, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.</u> The following evening, in partnership with Atrium Health and Queens University of Charlotte, the Charlotte Symphony will present *Music and Mind* with Renée Fleming, a conversation with local physicians, scientists, and practitioners working at the intersection of music, neuroscience, and healthcare.

Annual Gala and Concert

The Charlotte Symphony's Annual Gala Concert, led by Conductor Laureate Christopher Warren-Green, will feature the world's preeminent lyric soprano, Renée Fleming, performing celebrated songs from *La Bohème, The Sound of Music*, and *Adriana Lecouvreur*. A highlight of the evening, Ms. Fleming will also perform Richard Strauss's exquisitely beautiful Four Last Songs, which have become signature pieces for the soprano.

The Annual Gala will honor Christopher Warren-Green for his remarkable contributions to the Charlotte Symphony during his twelve years as Music Director. In addition to the concert, the black-tie event will include a pre-concert cocktail reception, an elegant post-concert dinner at Urban Garden, and tickets to *Music and Mind*.
